Plant drought-resistant lawns, shrubs and plants

If you are planting a new lawn, or overseeding an existing lawn, use drought-resistant grasses such as the new **"Eco-Lawn"**. Many beautiful shrubs and plants thrive with far less watering than other species. Replace herbaceous perennial borders with native plants. Native plants will use less water and be more resistant to local plant diseases. Plant slopes with plants that will retain water and help reduce runoff. Group plants according to their watering needs.

Put a layer of mulch around trees and plants

Mulch will slow evaporation of moisture while discouraging weed growth. Adding 2 - 4 inches of organic material such as compost or bark mulch will increase the ability of the soil to retain moisture. Press the mulch down around the drip line of each plant to form a slight depression which will prevent or minimize water runoff.

Don't water the gutter

Position your sprinklers so water lands on the lawn or garden, not on paved areas. Also, avoid watering on windy days.

Water your lawn only when it needs it

A good way to see if your lawn needs watering is to step on the grass. If it springs back up when you move, it doesn't need water. If it stays flat, the lawn is ready for watering. Letting the grass grow taller (to 3") will also promote water retention in the soil. Most lawns only need about 1" of water each week. During dry spells, you can stop watering altogether and the lawn will go brown and dormant. Once cooler weather arrives, the morning dew and rainfall will bring the lawn back to its usual vigor. This may result in a brown summer lawn, but it saves a lot of water.

Deep-soak your lawn

When watering the lawn, do it long enough for the moisture to soak down to the roots where it will do the most good. A light sprinkling can evaporate quickly and tends to encourage shallow root systems. Put an empty tuna can on your lawn - when it's full, you've watered about the right amount.

Water during the early parts of the day; avoid watering when it's windy

Early morning is generally better than dusk since it helps prevent the growth of fungus. Early watering, and late watering, also reduce water loss to evaporation. Watering early in the day is also the best defense against slugs and other garden pests. Try not to water when it's windy - wind can blow sprinklers off target and speed evaporation.

10 Tips for Water Conservation


1. When cleaning out fish tanks, give the nutrient rich water to your plants.
2. Don't use running water to thaw food. Defrost food in the refrigerator for water efficiency and food safety.
3. Plant in the fall when conditions are cooler and rainfall is more plentiful.
4. When doing laundry, match the water level to the size of the load.
5. Teach your children to turn off faucets tightly after each use.
6. Soak pots/pans rather than letting water run while you scrape them clean.
7. Use a water-efficient showerhead. They're inexpensive, easy to install, and can save you up to 750 gallons a month.
8. Use a commercial car wash that recycles water.
9. When running a bath, plug the tub before turning the water on, then adjust the temperature as the tub fills up.
10. We're more likely to notice leaky faucets indoors, be sure to check outdoor faucets, pipes and hoses.

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BAIERL FAMILY YMCA AQUATIC PROGRAM GUIDE SUMMER 2016 TOWN PARK POOL SEVEN FIELDS WEDNESDAYS July 14th–August 18th 9:00am–10:30am

DESCRIPTIONS

Inia/Perch (6mo-2yr): Parent and child are in the water together in this class. The class focuses on water adjustment, kicking, reaching, paddling, floating, blowing bubbles and following visual and verbal cues to make progress through the water. Games and songs are utilized to teach basic skills.

Pike (3-5yr): This class is designed for participants that would be considered true BEGINNERS to the water. Participant will work on the following skills: Float for 20 seconds on front and back with float belt, release pool wall, turn and grab wall with assistance, swim five feet on front, back or side without assistance, swim 10 yards on front, back and side with flotation device, ask for help, and apply pool rules.

Eel (3-5 yr): This class is for participants who are in the beginning stages of comfort in the water. Participant will work on the following skills: Float on front or back, jump in water and swim to wall independently, swim 15 feet on front, back or side independently, and swim 25 feet on front, back and side with flotation device.

Ray/Starfish (3-5yr): Participants will work on the following skills: Float on front and back for 30 seconds without assistance, tread water for 30 seconds, bob 10 times, jump in deep end, swim five feet, float on back for 10 seconds and return to wall, swim 20 feet on front, back and side without assistance, swim 25 yards on front or back with a flotation device, swim symmetrical paddle for 20 feet on front or back without assistance, and swim symmetrical paddle for 25 yards on front and back with flotation device.

Minnow (6-12yr): In this level, your swimmer will begin refining their stroke. All Minnows should be able to swim the length of the pool independently. Participant will work on the following skills: basic overarm front crawl for 25 yards with rotary breathing, basic breaststroke for 25 yards, basic sidestroke with scissors kick for 25 yards, basic overarm back crawl for 25 yards, and basic elementary backstroke for 25 yards.

PUBLIC SAFETY AWARENESS: DISTRACTED DRIVING



ANYTHING THAT CAUSES YOU TO EITHER TAKE YOUR ATTENTION AWAY FROM DRIVING, TAKE YOUR EYES OFF OF THE ROAD OR TAKE YOUR HANDS OFF OF THE WHEEL IS A DISTRACTION.

PENNSYLVANIA'S TEXTING-WHILE-DRIVING BAN

The law prohibits as a primary offense any driver from using an Interactive Wireless Communication Device (IWCD) to send, read or write a text-based communication while his or her vehicle is in motion.

- Defines an IWCD as a wireless phone, personal digital assistant, smart phone, portable or mobile computer or similar devices that can be used for texting, instant messaging, emailing or browsing the Internet.
- Defines a text-based communication as a text message, instant message, email or other written communication composed or received on an IWCD.
- Institutes a \$50 fine for convictions under this section.
- Makes clear that this law supersedes and preempts any local ordinances restricting the use of interactive wireless devices by drivers.

The penalty is a summary offense with a \$50 fine, plus court costs and other fees.

The violation carries no points as a penalty and will not be recorded on the driver record for non-commercial drivers. It will be recorded on commercial drivers' records as a non-sanction violation.

The texting ban does NOT include the use of a GPS device, a system or device that is physically or electronically integrated into the vehicle, or a communications device that is affixed to a mass transit vehicle, bus or school bus. The law does not authorize the seizure of an IWCD.

YOU WILL NOT BE ABLE TO REACT AS QUICKLY IF YOU ARE:

- Eating, drinking and smoking. These all create safety problems because they often require you to take your hands off of the wheel and take your eyes off of the road.
- Adjusting the radio, or CD player.
- Talking, texting or emailing on a cell phone or Blackberry.
- Interacting with other passengers. This is particularly a problem from novice or teenage drivers.
- Searching for or moving an object in the vehicle.
- Reading or writing.
- Personal grooming (combing hair, applying makeup).
- Rubbernecking when passing a crash scene or a work zone.

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


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


