Radar Speed Displays

The Evans City/Seven Fields Regional Police Department has implemented Radar Speed Displays throughout the community in an attempt to monitor and improve traffic flow. While the Radar Speed Displays require an initial investment in equipment, they have proven highly effective in lowering average speeds and improving roadway safety. They collect data that assist the police and community leaders in determining enforcement needs.

Radar speed display signs are effective in slowing cars down, particularly with today's highly visual, often distracted drivers. Also called speed display signs, driver feedback signs, and "your speed" signs, radar signs operate based on the theory that when we are presented with information about our performance, we tend to notice and improve.

Extensive research has proven that radar speed displays affect real and positive change on people's behavior. Speed radar display signs have been shown to slow drivers an average of 70%, usually for several miles. Using the radar speed display signs, the Evans City/Seven Fields Regional Police Department anticipates immediate and long lasting effects on the way motorists drive on our roads essentially providing a safer environment for all.

The Nanny Pass will only be issued to bona fide babysitters and are only permitted pool access when accompanied by the children for whom they have registered with the Borough that they baby sit.




Please welcome Joseph Jurysta

When It Rains, It Drains

Understanding Storm Water
and How It Can Affect
Your Money, Safety, Health,
and the Environment



Restoring Rain's Reputation: What Everyone Can Do To Help

Rain by nature is important for replenishing drinking water supplies, recreation, and healthy wildlife habitats. It only becomes a problem when pollutants from our activities like car maintenance, lawn care, and dog walking are left on the ground for rain to wash away. Here are some of the most important ways to prevent storm water pollution:

- ◆ Properly dispose of hazardous substances such as used oil, cleaning supplies and paint—never pour them down any part of the storm sewer system and report anyone who does.
- ◆ Use pesticides, fertilizers, and herbicides properly and efficiently to prevent excess runoff.
- ◆ Look for signs of soil and other pollutants, such as debris and chemicals, leaving construction sites in storm water runoff or tracked into roads by construction vehicles. Report poorly managed construction sites that could impact storm water runoff to your community. (See the back of this brochure for contact information.)
- ◆ Install innovative storm water practices on residential property, such as rain barrels or rain gardens, that capture storm water and keep it on site instead of letting it drain away into the storm sewer system.
- ◆ Report any discharges from storm water outfalls during times of dry weather—a sign that there could be a problem with the storm sewer system.
- ◆ Pick up after pets and dispose of their waste properly. No matter where pets make a mess—in a backyard or at the park—storm water runoff can carry pet waste from the land to the storm sewer system to a stream.
- ◆ Store materials that could pollute storm water indoors and use containers for outdoor storage that do not rust or leak to eliminate exposure of materials to storm water.

PUBLIC SAFETY AWARENESS: CAR SEAT RECOMMENDATIONS FOR CHILDREN

- Select a car seat based on your child's age & size, & choose a seat that fits in your vehicle and use it every time.
- Always refer to your specific car seat manufacturer's instructions; read the vehicle owner's manual on how to install the car seat using the seat belt or LATCH system; and check height and weight limits.
- To maximize safety, keep your child in the car seat for as long as possible, as long as the child fits within the manufacturer's height and weight requirements.
- Keep your child in the back seat at least through age 12.

Birth-12 Months

Your child under age 1 should always ride in a rear-facing car seat. There are different types of rear-facing car seats: Infant-only seats can only be used rear-facing. Convertible and 3-in-1 car seats typically have higher height and weight limits for the rear-facing position, allowing you to keep your child rear-facing for a longer period of time.

1-3 Years

Keep your child rear-facing as long as possible. It's the best way to keep him or her safe. Your child should remain in a rear-facing car seat until he or she reaches the top height or weight limit allowed by your car seat's manufacturer. Once your child outgrows the rear-facing car seat, your child is ready to travel in a forward-facing car seat with a harness.

4-7 Years

Keep your child in a forward-facing car seat with a harness until he or she reaches the top height or weight limit allowed by your car seat's manufacturer. Once your child outgrows the forward-facing car seat with a harness, it's time to travel in a booster seat, but still in the back seat.

8-12 Years

Keep your child in a booster seat until he or she is big enough to fit in a seat belt properly. For a seat belt to fit properly the lap belt must lie snugly across the upper thighs, not the stomach. The shoulder belt should lie snug across the shoulder and chest and not cross the neck or face. Remember: your child should still ride in the back seat because it's safer there.






