Council met on Monday, April 13, 2015 and approved the following:

- Proposal of \$10,000 from Pyrotecnico for 2015 Annual Community Day Carnival Fireworks, Sept 5th
- The six speed plateaus will not be reinstalled on Mars-Crider Road
- Proposal of \$475 from G.L. Nicklas Electric to change light system on the flag pole at Town Park
- Proposal of \$860 from The HITE Company for lighting systems for the flag poles at the Borough Building and the Adams Area Fire Department Building to be installed by the Public Works Dept.
- 2015 ADA Sidewalk Upgrade Program
- Proposal of \$5,065 from Steel City Flooring to replace flooring at the Town Park Community Center
- Awarded a \$7,500 grant from Butler County to assist in renovations to Northridge Park Playground







Town Park Pool Opening Day Saturday, May 23, 2015 Noon to 8:00pm (weather permitting)

The pool will be available for open swim from 11am—8pm, Monday through Friday and from noon-8pm on Saturdays and Sundays. The pool will be open through Labor Day, Monday, September 7, 2015.

There will be limited hours of operation on weekdays from 4pm-8pm beginning Tuesday May 26 through Friday June 5 and at the end of the season beginning Monday, August 31 through Friday, September 4, 2015.

Note that membership to the Seven Fields Town Park Pool is open to ALL Borough residents and non-residents.

Patrol Officer Trina Loesch



From the Seven Fields Emergency Management Coordinator

As we start to ramp up for summer and storm season, Seven Fields will be utilizing the Code Red Reverse 911 system in the following manor:

Severe Thunderstorm Warnings
Tornado Watches
Tornado Warnings

Every attempt will be made to put out a message that is in sync with what the National Weather Service is alerting. Please keep in mind that a warning indicates that severe weather/tornado is imminent and you should seek shelter. Warnings indicate that conditions are favorable.

In both cases, your family should have a plan to deal with severe weather and know what to do if you should be in the path of severe weather.

Here are some helpful tips:

1. Know your home. Know what area of your home you can go to and be as safe as possible. Usually this is in a basement or lower floor and as interior as you can get. Under a stairwell is a good example because of the extra reinforcements used. Try to place as many walls as possible between you and the exterior.
2. Have a meeting place. If this area (Seven Fields, Mars, Adams, Cranberry) should be hit by severe weather, make sure everyone knows where to meet. In some cases, cell towers can become damaged or loss of power for an extended time could interrupt normal communications.
3. If you need to move to a safe place in your home, turn your TV or radio up to a volume that you can hear from your safe place and tune it to the local news.
4. Make sure you have a flashlight in the area of your safe place. You don't want to run around at the last minute or in the dark to find one.
5. Please do not use candles. When there is damage to a home or surrounding property, there is always a risk of gas leaks.




