Ordinance 40
(Amended September 10, 2001)

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF SEVEN FIELDS, BUTLER COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, MAKING IT UNLAWFUL TO PERMIT DOMESTICATED OR NON-DOMESTICATED ANIMALS TO RUN AT LARGE; TO MAKE NOISE SO AS TO ANNOY ANY PERSON; TO DEFILE PROPERTY.

BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED BY the Council of the Borough of Seven Fields, Butler County, Pennsylvania and it is hereby enacted and ordained by the authority of the same.

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any owner or owners of dogs to permit the same to run at large within the Borough of Seven Fields.

Section 2. It shall be unlawful for any owner or owners of dogs or other animals to permit the same to make excessive, loud or harsh noise or disturbance which constantly or continuously, without cause, interferes with or deprives the peace, quiet, rest or sleep of any person within the Borough.

Section 3. It shall be unlawful for any owner or owners of dogs or other animals to keep the same when the animal exhibits a habit of making excessive noise or other actions to the disturbance, annoyance or fright of persons in the vicinity or passersby.

Section 4. It shall be the responsibility of the dog owner to collect and properly dispose of dog feces deposited by their dog on any public or private property within the Borough. Feces must be picked-up immediately by the dog owner and disposed of in the owners refuse receptacle.

Section 5. Any dog found running at large within the Borough of Seven Fields shall be taken and impounded in a place provided for that purpose. If the owner is known or the marks or identification can be found on the animal so that the owner can be ascertained, said owner shall be immediately be given notice either personally or by registered mail to claim the dog within ten (10) days.


Section 6. All animals so taken and seized shall be detained and properly kept and fed, and if claimed by the owner, shall be removed immediately by said person.

Section 7. All animals so taken and seized shall be detained and subsequently claimed shall pay a penalty of five dollars (\$5.00) and all reasonable expenses.

Section 8. If after ten (10) days from the giving of such notice the animal is not claimed, said animal shall be disposed of in a humane manner or given to such person or persons who desire to care for the same. Such animal may also be sold for expenses.

Section 9. All commercial establishments licensed to keep animals shall maintain and provide enclosures which are of sound-reducing construction for the keeping of animals where practical, and no such establishment shall maintain any facility which would permit animals to become an unreasonable disturbance, annoyance or fright to persons in the vicinity.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, any person who shall be convicted of a violation of any of the provisions of this amended Ordinance Number 40 before a District Magistrate having jurisdiction shall be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than three hundred dollars (\$300.00) together with costs of prosecution, to imprisonment in the county jail for a term not to exceed thirty (30) days, or both.

BOROUGH OF SEVEN FIELDS
ORDINANCE NO. 40

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF SEVEN FIELDS, BUTLER COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, MAKING IT UNLAWFUL TO PERMIT DOMESTICATED OR NON-DOMESTICATED ANIMALS TO RUN AT LARGE: TO PERMIT OTHER DOMESTICATED OR NON-DOMESTICATED ANIMALS TO MAKE CERTAIN NOISES SO AS TO ANNOY ANY PERSON: AND TO PERMIT DOMESTICATED OR NON-DOMESTICATED ANIMALS TO DEFILE AND BEFOUL PROPERTY: ALL IN THE BOROUGH OF SEVEN FIELDS AND IMPOSING PENALTIES THEREFOR.

BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED BY the Council of the Borough of Seven Fields, Butler County, Pennsylvania and it is hereby enacted and ordained by the authority of the same.

SECTION 1. No domesticated animal or any non-domesticated animal shall be permitted to run at large in this Borough either upon the public streets or highways or upon property other than the owner of such animal.

SECTION 2. No person shall allow any domesticated animal or any non-domesticated animal confined on that person's premises to make any loud or harsh noise or disturbance which constantly or continuously, without cause, interferes with or deprives the peace, quiet, rest or sleep or any person within the Borough.

SECTION 3. No person shall allow any domesticated animal or any non-domesticated animal owned by him or under his control to defile, corrupt or otherwise desecrate or destroy any sidewalk, walkway or the property of another.

SECTION 4. Any person, firm or corporation who shall violate any provision of this Ordinance, shall upon conviction thereof, be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than Three Hundred (\$300.00) Dollars, and/or to imprisonment for a term not to exceed ninety (90) days.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF SEVEN FIELDS, BUTLER COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, MAKING IT UNLAWFUL TO PERMIT DOMESTICATED OR NON-DOMESTICATED ANIMALS TO RUN AT LARGE: TO PERMIT OTHER DOMESTICATED OR NON-DOMESTICATED ANIMALS TO MAKE CERTAIN NOISES SO AS TO ANNOY ANY PERSON: AND TO PERMIT DOMESTICATED OR NON-DOMESTICATED ANIMALS TO DEFILE AND BEFOUL PROPERTY: ALL IN THE BOROUGH OF SEVEN FIELDS AND IMPOSING PENALTIES THEREFORE.

BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED BY the Council of the Borough of Seven Fields, Butler County, Pennsylvania and it is hereby enacted and ordained by the authority of the same.

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any owner or owners of dogs or cats to permit the same to run at large within the Borough of Seven Fields.

Section 2. It shall be unlawful for any owner or owners of dogs or cats or other animals to permit the same to make excessive noise to the disturbance, annoyance or fright of persons in the vicinity or passersby.

Section 3. It shall be unlawful for any owner or owners of dogs or cats or other animals to keep the same when the animal exhibits a habit of making excessive noise to the disturbance, annoyance or fright of persons in the vicinity or passersby.

RESOLVED, any dog or cat found running at large within the Borough of Seven Fields shall be taken and impounded in a place provided for that purpose. If the owner is known or the marks or identification can be found on the animal so that the owner can be ascertained, said owner shall immediately be given notice either personally or by registered mail to claim the dog or cat within ten (10) days.

RESOLVED, All animals so taken and seized shall be detained and properly kept and fed, and if claimed by the owner, shall be removed immediately by said person.

RESOLVED, the owner of a dog or cat so detained and subsequently claimed shall pay a penalty of five dollars (\$5.00) and all reasonable expenses.

RESOLVED, if after ten (10) days from the giving of such notice the animal is not claimed, said animal shall be disposed of in a humane manner or given to such person or persons who desire to care for the same. Such animal may also be sold for expenses.

RESOLVED, Sections 2 and 3 do not apply to commercial establishments licensed to keep animals in the Borough of Seven Fields.

RESOLVED, all such establishments shall maintain and provide enclosures which are of sound-reducing construction for the keeping of animals where practical, and no such establishment shall maintain any facility which would permit animals to become an unreasonable disturbance, annoyance or fright to persons in the vicinity.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, any person who shall be convicted of a violation of any of the provisions of this Amended Ordinance Number 40 or Ordinance Number 40 before a District Magistrate having jurisdiction shall be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than three hundred dollars (\$300.00), together with costs of prosecution, or to imprisonment in the county jail for a term not to exceed thirty (30) days, or both.

THIS AGREEMENT is entered into this 11th day of March, 2002, between

SEVEN FIELDS BOROUGH, a municipality existing under the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, with its principal place of business situated at 2200 Garden Drive, Suite 100, Seven Fields, PA 16046, hereinafter called "Borough".


Eugene Henry hereby agrees to perform the following services for the Borough for the term of this contract as the Borough's Animal Control Officer:

- The general control and pickup of dogs found to be in violation of Act 1982-225 (the "Dog Law") and subsequent amendments and applicable Borough Ordinances.
- Said services shall be performed by Eugene Henry who shall be on call during regular business hours Monday through Friday. Eugene Henry shall respond to calls from the Cranberry Township Police Department and Borough residents.
- Eugene Henry shall also provide a twenty-four (24) hour emergency service to the Borough in which he shall act upon requests from the Cranberry Township Police. Service thereunder shall include the pick-up and transportation of any dog to the Butler County Humane Society shelter.
- All requests shall be acted upon within 8 hours of receipt by Eugene Henry.
- Within ten (10) days after the end of each month, Eugene Henry shall submit to the Borough a detailed listing of any calls received, responses and dispositions. A report will not be required for months with no animal control activities.
- Eugene Henry shall provide the Borough with telephone numbers where he can receive requests for services from the Cranberry Township Police Department.
- Eugene Henry shall be prohibited from carrying a firearm while acting as the Animal Control Officer for the Borough of Seven Fields.

The Borough hereby agrees to pay Eugene Henry the sum of \$20.00 per response plus \$0.36.5/mile for services performed herein unless otherwise mutually adjusted by the parties hereto. Payment by the Borough shall be made each month based on an activity report and request for payment provided by Eugene Henry.


Eugene Henry shall take and file with the Borough the required oath of office for service as Animal Control Officer. The oath shall be acknowledged by Eugene Henry, and a copy shall be filed with the Magistrate having jurisdiction in the Borough of Seven Fields. The authority vested within the Eugene Henry shall continue until such time as he is released of his duties by the Borough. This agreement shall be enforced for one year from the date hereof.

Eugene Henry and the Borough hereby enter into this agreement, this 11th day of March, 2002.



the Borough of Seven Fields existing under the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, with its principal place of business situate at 142 Moss Side Loop, Mars, Pa. 16046, hereinafter "Borough"

James Luna hereby agrees to perform the following services for the Borough of Seven Fields for the term of this contract:

The general control and pickup of dogs found to be in violation of Act 1982-225 (the "Dog Law") and subsequent amendments and applicable Borough Ordinances.

Said services shall be performed by James Luna who shall be on call during regular business hours Monday through Friday. James Luna shall respond to calls from the Cranberry Township Police Department and Borough residents.

James Luna shall also provide a twenty-four (24) hour emergency service to Borough in which he shall act upon requests from the Cranberry Township Police Department personnel. Service thereunder shall include pickup and carrying away any dogs.

All requests shall be acted upon within the same day of receipt by James Luna. James Luna shall sign a log sheet with the Police Department each time he enters the Borough for a call or patrol.

James Luna shall provide the Borough with telephone numbers where he can receive requests for services from the Police Department.

Borough hereby agrees that the services provided by James Luna will be included in the Cranberry Township Police Department contract with the Borough of Seven Fields for the year of 1993 unless otherwise mutually adjusted by the parties hereto.

In addition to the agreed payments aforementioned, James Luna shall be entitled to keep any pickup fees and/or boarding fees paid by dog owners to James Luna which might otherwise be designated by statute to be paid to Borough. James Luna shall also be entitled to retain any fees paid by him by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania for any service performed under the State "Dog Law".

James Luna and any other employee of James Luna shall, if he has not previously done so, take and have filed with the Borough, the required oath of office for service as Animal Control Officer. Each oath shall be acknowledged by the affidavit, and a copy shall be filed with the Magistrate having jurisdiction with the Borough of Seven Fields. The authority vested within each affiant shall continue until such time as the affiant is released of his or her duties by the Borough of Seven Fields.

The ~~Township of Cranberry~~ ^{Borough of Seven Fields (cc)} shall be responsible for obtaining, providing, carrying, and maintaining in force during the continuance of this Agreement, a general liability insurance policy on James Luna's activities as Animal Control Office for the Borough of Seven Fields during the year of 1993.


James Luna, at his sole cost and expense, will be responsible for obtaining, providing, carrying and maintaining his own medical benefit insurance coverage and business auto insurance coverage.

Firearms. James Luna or any of his employees or agents carrying a firearm shall be certified and licensed as required by various state and local agencies. In addition, prior approval by the Township of Cranberry Police Chief must be received for James Luna or any of his employees or agents to carry a firearm in the Borough of Seven Fields.

James Luna and the Borough of Seven Fields enter into this Agreement with the intent to be legally bound hereby, this 1st day of March, 1993 for a trail period ending in December 1993.
