BOROUGH OF SEVEN FIELDS ORDINANCE #35

An Ordinance of the Borough of Seven Fields, County of Butler, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, establishing restrictions and guidelines for use of public areas owned by the Borough of Seven Fields.

WHEREAS, the Borough of Seven Fields has acquired and will acquire in the future real property that is zoned as conservation districts and which is to be left undeveloped and to be open to the public for its use; and

WHEREAS, the real property to be administered under this Ordinance is to be left in an undeveloped and natural state, except for the possible addition of walking trails and picnic areas; and

WHEREAS, the Council of the Borough of Seven Fields finds that it is in the best interest of the residents of the Borough to establish rules and regulations for the use of said real property.

1. Real Property. The real property to be covered by this Ordinance, is that real property as described on Schedule A, attached hereto, incorporated herein, and made a part hereof.

2. Prohibited Activities.

- A. It shall be unlawful for any person other than a Borough employee or agent to operate any motorized vehicle upon the said real property.
- B. It shall be unlawful for any person to use, carry, or have upon their person or in their presence any alcoholic beverages upon the said real property.
- $\ensuremath{\text{\textbf{C}}}.$ No dumping or littering shall be permitted upon the real property.
- D. That no person shall operate loud radios or other music or sound producing devices upon the said property or in any other way disturb the peace of the Borough.
- E. The said real property shall not be open to the public for use by Borough residents, their guests, or invitees, between the hours of 1:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. each day.

3. A. Any person who violates any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall upon conviction, be fined not less than \$50 for the first violation and not less than \$50 or more than \$300 for the second and succeeding violations.
