## BOROUGH OF SEVEN FIELDS - REPEAL OF ORDINANCE #2

An ordinance of the Borough of Seven Fields, County of Butler, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, to repeal Ordinance #2.

WHEREAS, Ordinance #2 of the Borough of Seven Fields was ordained and enacted on January 3, 1984, and reviewed and approved by the mayor on January 6, 1984; and

WHEREAS, said Ordinance #2 was an Ordinance for Borough police and security protection, granting the Borough of Seven Fields exclusive privilege to establish a police department within the boundary of the borough; and

WHEREAS, by actions of Council of the Borough, which are a matter of public record, police protection is now provided for the Borough under contract with the Township of Cranberry, Butler County, Pennsylvania; and

WHEREAS, the maintenance of a separate police department is no longer necessary for the provision of public safety and security within the bounds of the Borough of Seven Fields, and said police department no longer provides any independent or necessary services; and

WHEREAS, if at any future date the Borough requires an independent police department to be established, it may do so through the adoption of a new Ordinance authorizing same.

NOW THEREFORE, the Borough of Seven Fields does hereby adopt this Ordinance as follows:

Section I. That all of the provisions of Ordinance #2 as

hereinabove referred to, of the Borough of Seven Fields, is hereby repealed and the terms of Ordinance #2 are made null and void and the Seven Fields Police Department is hereby disbanded and discontinued.
