Seven Fields Town Park Pool NOW OPEN!

- ◆ The Borough of Seven Fields will open the Town Park Pool on July 3rd. The Town Park Pool Hours of Operation will be Thursday through Sunday, 11:00 am to 8:00 pm. Borough Management will reevaluate pool operations periodically and reserves the right to make operational adjustments as needed for efficiency.
- ◆ There will be 2 sessions from 11:00 am – 2:30 pm and 3:30 pm – 8:00 pm. All Patrons will be asked to leave the pool at this time to allow for deep cleaning of the pool facilities.
- ◆ No changing areas or showers will be available. Patrons are to come into the pool area dressed to swim. The bathroom facilities in the men and women’s locker rooms will be available for use.
- ◆ Pool chairs will not be available for use. We ask that all patrons bring chairs, blankets, or towels to sit on.
- ◆ No concession services will be available – Patrons may bring coolers, however no glass bottles and containers or alcohol are allowed. You will be responsible for cleaning your area before you leave the pool.
- ◆ There will not be a Lost and Found in 2020.
- ◆ The baby pool, spray pad, and slide will not be in used in 2020.

Patrons are asked to continue to maintain social distancing while at the pool. Parents, please monitor your children’s social distancing. If you are unable to stay 6 feet away from anyone other than your family unit, we ask that you wear a mask, except for when you are in the pool.

Management reserves the right to ask you to leave the pool if you are not complying with the aforementioned guidelines.

PET SUMMER SAFETY GUIDE

Beat the heat and keep your pets safe this summer!



APPLY SUNSCREEN

Although fur helps provide protection, areas around your pet's **mouth, ears** and **belly** remain susceptible to sunburn. Use sunscreen made specifically for dogs to give your pooch an extra shield from the harmful rays.

DON'T WALK YOUR PUP DURING PEAK SUN HOURS



DODGE HOT ASPHALT

Hot concrete and asphalt can burn your pet's sensitive paw pads. If it's too hot for you, it's too hot for your pet.

Don't Walk Your Pup During Peak Sun Hours.

Avoid walking your dog during the hottest part of the day. If you're unable to walk your dog when it's cooler outside, hire a professional pet sitter.

FIND SHADE

When playing outside, make sure there's plenty of shade for **cooling down** and always make sure your pet has clean, fresh water.



KEEP YOUR PET HYDRATED.

Always use caution when leaving your dog outside, especially when you're away from home. If your pet is outside, make sure they have access to shade and clean, cool water.

SOME PETS ARE MORE LIKELY TO OVERHEAT

Special care and observation should be taken with dogs who are prone to overheating. This includes short-nosed dogs (such as pugs), senior and geriatric pets, as well as pets on medication or those who have specific health conditions such as diabetes and liver or kidney disease.



DON'T LEAVE YOUR PET IN THE CAR

NEVER leave your pet alone in a parked car—even if it's just for a few minutes. Cars can heat up quickly and can cause heatstroke and hyperthermia, which can result in death.



DOG HOUSES AREN'T COOL

DON'T rely on a dog house to shield your pup from the sun. Make sure dog houses are in the shade and have proper ventilation because a dog house can be just as dangerous as a hot car.



KEEP YOUR YARD PET-FRIENDLY

Make sure you use pet safe products in your yard. **Azaleas, lilies** and certain plant food can be fatal to pets.



KEEP GRILLING SUPPLIES OUT OF REACH

Dogs love hanging out by the grill and they might mistake something like **charcoal briquettes** for food and become sick.



BE AWARE OF CAR COOLANT

Coolant that leaks from your car or is left out is extremely dangerous for pets. Pets enjoy the smell and may drink the coolant, which can be fatal.

Council met on Monday, July 13th and approved the following:

- Borough Council approved Resolution 2020-22 appointing Brocton Skeen to the Seven Fields Zoning Hearing Board to fill a vacant seat with a term expiring 12/31/2022
- Borough Council voted to cancel the 2020 Seven Fields Music, Beer & Wine Fest in light of the resurgence of COVID-19 and the safety of all who would have attended
- Borough Council voted to suspend the 2020 Seven Fields Food Truck Nights as currently planned—Borough Council discussed planning an event with Food Trucks later on in 2020




EVANS CITY/SEVEN FIELDS REGIONAL POLICE DEPARTMENT

Temporary Burn Ban In Effect Until Further Notice For Seven Fields Residents

At the recommendation of The Adams Area Fire District, all open burning in Seven Fields has been banned until further notice. No Burn Permits will be issued during this time.

Due to the extremely dry conditions and high temperatures our area has been experiencing recently, we feel this is a necessary precaution for the safety of all of our residents. This decision will be reevaluated bi-weekly.

An announcement will be posted on the Seven Fields website and social media outlets when the burn ban can be lifted.

HOME IMPROVEMENTS IN SEVEN FIELDS

REMINDER! Before you begin that big home improvement project, please keep the following in mind:

- ◆ The Borough requires building permits for decks, fences, enclosed porches, etc. Please call or stop by the Borough Office to obtain a building permit application at least one week before you anticipate construction.
- ◆ To limit construction noise and annoyances, Borough Ordinance #48 prohibits construction activities to begin prior to 7 a.m. Monday through Saturday, and no exterior construction may occur on Sundays.

FALSE ALARMS

In Accordance with Ordinance #34—False Alarm (s)

Residents are reminded: A false alarm is defined as any alarm to which the police, fire department or ambulance responds resulting from the activation of an alarm device when a crime, fire or other emergency warranting immediate action by the police, fire department or ambulance has not in fact occurred.

Accidental false alarms—any person causing accidental false alarms for any reason shall pay to the Borough of Seven Fields a charge for each and every accidental false alarm to which the police, fire and/or EMS or other emergency service responds, in each calendar year, as follows:

First alarm each year	No Charge
Second to fifth alarm each year	\$100.00
Sixth to tenth alarm each year	\$200.00
Tenth or more alarm each year	\$250.00

Please help us keep emergency personnel where they are truly needed. If you are having trouble with your security system, please contact your security company so they may assist you in resolving the problem in a timely manner to prevent further false alarms and charges.

Dog Walking & Pet Waste Reminders

Residents are reminded that Ordinance #40 mandates that pet owners must pick up their dog feces when walking their dogs through the community.

Please note that pets are NOT permitted in the Town Park.

This includes the entire park, playground, pool, fields, etc.

Not only is it a violation against Ordinance #40, it is also a safety hazard for children playing in the playground area.

Individuals are encouraged to call 911 to report offenders to the Evans City/Seven Fields Regional Police Department.



HOW TO GET TESTED FOR COVID-19

PENNSYLVANIA RESIDENT



I HAVE MILD SYMPTOMS:

Please stay home. If you feel worse, contact your health care provider.



I HAVE SEVERE SYMPTOMS:

If you have a fever over 100°, shortness of breath and cough, CALL your health care provider.

If you do not have a health care provider, CALL your local health department or 1-877-PA-HEALTH.

If you still need help, CALL your local emergency department.

HEALTH CARE PROVIDER



I FEEL A PATIENT SHOULD BE TESTED:

Order a test without consulting with the Department of Health through a commercial lab.



I WANT TO CONSULT WITH DOH TO SEE IF A TEST IS NEEDED:

Call 1-877-PA-HEALTH.



I CONSULTED BUT DOH DOESN'T RECOMMEND A TEST:

If you feel that a patient should be tested, order a test through a commercial lab.

THE STATE PUBLIC HEALTH LABORATORY IS PRIORITIZING THE FOLLOWING PEOPLE FOR TESTING:

1. People who are severely sick for unknown reasons
2. People in congregate care settings
3. People in contact with known cases of COVID-19
4. Symptomatic healthcare workers and first responders
